INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE USMCA CERTIFICATION OF ORIGIN

For purposes of obtaining preferential tariff treatment, this document must be completed legibly and in full, and be in the possession of the importer at the time the declaration is made.

This document may be completed by the importer, exporter, or producer.

1. Certification of Origin	Indicate whether the certifier is the exporter, producer or importer.
2. Blanket Period	Indicate the duration of the Certificate. The blanket period cannot exceed a period of one year.
3. Importer	Provide, if known, the Importer's name, address, e-mail address, and telephone number. The address of the importer shall be in a Party's territory. If the importer name and address are not known, state "Unknown."
4. Exporter	Provide the Exporter's name, address (including country), e-mail address, and telephone number if different from the certifier. This information is not required if the producer is completing the certification of origin and does not know the identity of the exporter; state "Unknown." The address of the exporter shall be the place of export of the good in a Party's territory. If the information is the same as the Certifier, state "Same as Certifier."
5. Certifier	Provide the certifier's name, title, address (including country), telephone number, and email address.
6. Producer	Provide the producer's name, address (including country), e-mail address, and telephone number, if different from the certifier or exporter or, if there are multiple producers, state "Various" or provide a list of producers. A person that wishes for this information to remain confidential may state "Available upon request by the importing authorities". The address of a producer shall be the place of production of the good in a Party's territory.
7. Commodity Description & HS Tariff Classification	Commodity Description: Provide a description of the good and the HS tariff classification of the good to the 6-digit level (except, in the case that the relevant rule of origin for the good requires eight digits, identify to the 8-digit level using the HS tariff classification of the USMCA Party into whose territory the good is imported). The description should be sufficient to relate it to the good covered by the certification HS Tariff Classification Number: If the certification of origin covers a single shipment of a good, indicate, if known, the invoice number related to the exportation.
8. Origin Crierion	Specify the origin criterion (A, B, C, or D) under which the good qualifies, as set out in Article 4.2 (Originating Goods): A - The good is wholly obtained or produced entirely in the territory of one or more of the USMCA countries, as defined in Article 4.3 of the Agreement; B - The good is produced entirely in the territory of one or more of the USMCA countries using nonoriginating materials, provided the good satisfies all applicable requirements of product-specific rules of origin; C - The good is produced entirely in the territory of one or more of the USMCA countries exclusively from originatingmaterials; or D - The good is produced entirely in the territory of one or more of the USMCA 6 countries. 9. Certification	The certification must be signed and dated by the certifier.
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
